Consultation on proposed 6-month extension to the Australian Rail Track Corporation's 2008 Interstate Access Undertaking

The ACCC invites submissions on the Australian Rail Track Corporation's (ARTC) application to extend its 2008 Interstate Access Undertaking (the 2008 IAU) (the Application). The Application was submitted on 6 May 2024 pursuant to subsection 44ZZBB(1) of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* (Cth) (CCA).

Background

The ACCC accepted the 2008 IAU in July 2008. The 2008 IAU (as amended) sets out the terms and conditions of access for parties seeking to operate trains on ARTC's Interstate network.¹

On 12 December 2023 ARTC submitted its 2024 Interstate Access Undertaking proposal which would replace the 2008 IAU.² On 17 April 2024, due to a number of issues raised in stakeholder submissions, the ACCC sent a letter to ARTC regarding an extension of the current undertaking until 31 December 2024.³ This would allow sufficient time for consultation on ARTC's proposed undertaking and ensure there is no uncertainty for users as to whether the statutory assessment processes will be finalised before the existing undertaking is currently scheduled to expire on 30 June 2024.

Proposed effect of the Application

The Application from ARTC is to extend the term of the 2008 IAU for a further period of 6 months. ARTC seeks to do so by amending clause 2.3(a) of the 2008 IAU to replace the words '30 June 2024' with 'the earlier of 31 December 2024 or 21 days after the acceptance by the ACCC of ARTC's proposed 2024 IAU as submitted on 12 December 2023'. The Application does not propose to make any other amendments to the 2008 IAU.

Submissions

The ACCC invites submissions on the Application by **5:00pm (AEST) Wednesday**, **22 May 2024**.

In deciding whether to extend the period for which the undertaking is in operation under subsection 44ZZBB(3) of the CCA, the ACCC must have regard to the matters set out in subsection 44ZZA(3) of the CCA (Annex A). In making a submission, parties are encouraged to address those matters.

Annex A

Subsection 44ZZA(3) of the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Cth)

- (3) The Commission may accept the undertaking, if it thinks it appropriate to do so having regard to the following matters:
 - (aa) the objects of this Part;
 - (ab) the pricing principles specified in section 44ZZCA;
 - (a) the legitimate business interests of the provider;
 - (b) the public interest, including the public interest in having competition in markets (whether or not in Australia);
 - (c) the interests of persons who might want access to the service;
 - (da) whether the undertaking is in accordance with an access code that applies to the service;
 - (e) any other matters that the Commission thinks are relevant.
