Transport Workers Union of Australia SA/NT Branch – collective bargaining application for authorisation A91589 (Whyalla) – final determination

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) has issued a determination in respect of the application for authorisation lodged by the Transport Workers Union of Australia SA/NT Branch (the **TWU**) on 27 June 2017.

A copy of the ACCC's determination and summary of its reasons is attached.

For the reasons set out in its determination, the ACCC has decided to grant authorisation until 15 December 2022.

Application for review

Pursuant to section 101 of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010*, a person dissatisfied with this determination may apply to the Australian Competition Tribunal (the **Tribunal**) for a review of the determination. An application for review must be made within 21 days of the date of this determination; that is, on or before 14 December 2017. If no application for a review is lodged by this date, the ACCC's determination will come into force on 15 December 2017.

An application for a review of the ACCC's determination should be lodged directly with the Tribunal. The Tribunal is a separate body from the ACCC and is located within the Federal Court of Australia.
