Re: AgStewardship Australia Ltd application for re-authorisation AA1000429 - draft determination

QFF welcomes the opportunity to provide comment on the AgStewardship Australia Limited application for re-authorisation AA1000429 - (draft determination, dated 9 November 2018). QFF provides this submission without prejudice to any additional submission provided by our members or individual farmers.

QFF notes that the ACCC proposes to grant authorisation to enable AgStewardship to continue to administer and collect a levy on the sale of agricultural and veterinary chemicals by participating manufacturers to fund the operation of the drumMUSTER® and ChemClear® programs.

The ACCC has authorised a levy of four (4) cents per litre/kilogram since 1998 and has provisionally approved in the draft determination AgStewardship's request to increase the levy to six (6) cents per litre/kilogram. QFF understands that AgStewardship has not sought any other changes to the levy or programs.

QFF supports the re-authorisation of these stewardship programs, which have set the global benchmark in industry stewardship programs, including increasing the levy from four (4) to six (6) cents per litre/kilogram to ensure their ongoing sustainability.
