Logan City Council & Ors application for authorisation AA1000437—interested party consultation

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has received an application for authorisation from a group of five Councils in south-east Queensland (Logan, Ipswich, Redlands, Lockyer Valley and Somerset) (the Applicants). The ACCC invites you to comment on the application. Attached is a summary of the authorisation process including how to make a submission to the ACCC.

The Applicants have sought authorisation to collectively tender for waste processing services. The services will be limited to the processing or disposal of resources and/or waste and will not include waste collection services, waste transport services, or the operation of existing waste transfer stations and tip shops. The Applicants are seeking authorisation until 31 December 2050 to provide a waste stream contract of sufficient length to underwrite investment in a new processing facility in the region.

A full copy of the application for authorisation is available on the ACCC's website in the Authorisations Register.

Interim authorisation

The Applicants have requested interim authorisation to allow them to commence the tender process, given existing waste processing contracts expire in mid to late 2019.

The ACCC decides whether to grant interim authorisation on a case by case basis. Should an applicant request interim authorisation, the ACCC will usually consider a range of factors, including harm to the applicant and other parties if interim is or is not granted, possible benefit and detriment to the public, the urgency of the matter and whether the market would be able to return to substantially its pre-interim state if the ACCC should later deny authorisation.

Request for submissions

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements.

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to the Applicants' application for authorisation, including its request for interim authorisation, please do so by **4 March 2019**. Submissions should be emailed to adjudication@accc.gov.au with the subject 'AA1000437 Logan City Council & Ors – submission'.

Submissions will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion. The <u>Guidelines for excluding information from the public register for authorisation and notification processes</u> are available on the ACCC website.

Timetable

The ACCC will progress its assessment of the application in a timely manner. An indicative timetable is set out below for your information

4 March 2019	Closing date for submissions on both interim authorisation and re-authorisation.

March	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process.

May/June	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
June/July	Final determination.
