Dear Interested Party

The Medical Technology Association of Australia Limited's application for authorisation AA1000479—interim authorisation decision and interested party consultation

On 14 April 2020, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) received an application for authorisation from the Medical Technology Association of Australia Limited (**MTAA**) (**the application**). The application is an amended form of an application previously submitted by the MTAA on 24 March 2020.

The application for authorisation

The application was lodged on behalf of the MTAA, its members and other relevant businesses in the medical technology industry (together, **the Applicants**), to enable them to implement a coordinated strategy in relation to the supply of medical equipment and supplies in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Applicants seek authorisation to make and give effect to arrangements, and to exchange information for the purpose of facilitating the supply of, and access to, medical technology and supplies, including ICU ventilators, COVID-19 testing kits and personal protective equipment (the **Proposed Conduct**).

The Applicants have sought interim authorisation for the Proposed Conduct, as well as authorisation for a period of 12 months from the date of the ACCC's final determination on the application.

The ACCC initially granted interim authorisation to the Applicants on 25 March 2020. The MTAA subsequently amended its earlier application to expand the information sharing and coordination amongst the Applicants. Broadly, the amendments have the effect of adding information sharing on demand and freight issues, and adding coordination of procurement of inputs and manufacturing of medical equipment and consumables.

A copy of the application for authorisation, which shows amendments to the previous application submitted by MTAA on 24 March 2020, is available on the <u>ACCC's Public Register</u>.

Interim authorisation

On 17 April 2020, the ACCC granted conditional interim authorisation for the Proposed Conduct. At the same time, the ACCC revoked the interim authorisation granted on 25 March 2020.

The interim authorisation is subject to conditions, including that the MTAA must provide regular updates to the ACCC regarding any material developments and decisions in relation to the Proposed Conduct, and must give notice to the ACCC if it is proposed that the Applicants will engage in certain elements of the Proposed Conduct.

A copy of the ACCC's 17 April interim authorisation decision, which contains more detail on the Proposed Conduct and on the conditions, is also available on the <u>ACCC's Public</u> Register.

Submissions

The ACCC is now conducting a public consultation process on the Proposed Conduct authorised in its interim authorisation decision, and on the substantive application for final authorisation, and invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the Proposed Conduct.

We recognise that the COVID-19 situation may be causing disruptions to your normal operations. For this reason we are taking a flexible approach to receiving feedback on the Proposed Conduct. We will accept written submissions at any time up until **8 May 2020**, however you may wish to contact us by phone to discuss your views before this deadline.

Submissions, including a record of oral submissions, will be placed on the <u>ACCC's public</u> register subject to any request for exclusion (see the <u>ACCC guidelines</u> for more information).
