Application for authorisation AA1000540 lodged by Qantas Airways Limited and Japan Airlines Co Ltd – interested party consultation

On 18 December 2020, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) received an application for authorisation from Qantas Airways Limited (**Qantas**) and Japan Airlines Co Ltd (**JAL**), together the Applicants, for a Joint Business Agreement. This letter is to invite you to comment.

The Applicants are seeking authorisation¹ under the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* (Cth). Authorisation would give Qantas and JAL legal protection to enter into the Joint Business Agreement in relation to their operations across a range of routes between Australia/New Zealand and Japan.

The Applicants submit that the Joint Business Agreement will enable them to work together in respect of marketing and sales, pricing, scheduling, distribution strategies and agency arrangements, yield and inventory management, frequent flyer programs, lounges, joint procurement, product and service standards and cargo.

The Applicants are seeking authorisation for the Joint Business Agreement and associated agreements for three years. A full copy of the application for authorisation is available on the ACCC's authorisations public register.

Interim authorisation

The Applicants are also seeking interim authorisation to enter into the Joint Business Agreement. The ACCC will consider the request for interim authorisation at the time of issuing a draft determination about the application.

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the application for authorisation. In making your submission, please provide information, evidence and views about the likely public benefits, effects on competition and any other public detriment that you consider will result from the proposed conduct.

If you intend to provide a submission, please do so by **29 January 2021**. If you wish to request an extension, please contact us on the details below as early as possible. Submissions after the due date (or after any extension granted) may not be taken into account.
