## 7-Eleven and Velocity application for authorisation AA1000549 — final determination

The ACCC has issued a final determination in respect of the application for authorisation lodged by 7-Eleven Stores Pty Limited on behalf of itself, its franchisees and Velocity Frequent Flyer Pty Ltd on 24 March 2021.

For the reasons set out in its final determination, the ACCC has granted authorisation for 5 years to enable 7-Eleven to participate as a retail, and potential redemption, partner of Velocity's loyalty program. A copy of the ACCC's final determination is attached and also available on the ACCC's authorisations public register.

## **Application for review**

Pursuant to section 101 of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* (Cth), a person dissatisfied with this determination may apply to the Australian Competition Tribunal for its review. An application for review must be made within 21 days of the date of this determination; that is, on or before 18 August 2021. If no application to review is lodged by this date, the ACCC's determination will come into force on 19 August 2021.

An application for review of the ACCC's determination should be lodged directly with the Australian Competition Tribunal. The Australian Competition Tribunal is a separate body from the ACCC and is located within the Federal Court of Australia.
