### **Coles Group Limited and participating supermarkets – Application for authorisation AA1000546 – Interim authorisation decision and interested party consultation**

On 12 March 2021, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) received an application for authorisation from Coles Group Limited (**Coles**). This letter is to invite you to comment. You are welcome to pass this letter on to others who may wish to make submissions.

Coles seeks authorisation on behalf of itself and Woolworths Group Limited, ALDI Stores (A Limited Partnership) and Metcash Limited to cooperate among themselves (and with other approved supermarkets) in response to the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure the supply and fair and equitable distribution of retail products to Australian consumers (the **Proposed Conduct**).

The Participating Supermarkets have an existing authorisation AA1000477 for substantially similar conduct which is due to expire on 31 March 2021 (the **Existing Authorisation**). The new authorisation has been sought to allow this cooperation to continue beyond 31 March 2021.

Coles is seeking authorisation until 31 March 2022. A full copy of the application for authorisation is available on the ACCC's [authorisations public register](#).

### **Interim authorisation**

Because Coles' new application for authorisation was not lodged until shortly before the Existing Authorisation expires, the ACCC will not be able to make a final decision about the new application before 31 March 2021. Therefore, Coles also requested interim authorisation to enable the supermarkets to continue to engage in the above conduct, prior to the ACCC's final determination in relation to the substantive application for authorisation.

Interim authorisation protects the arrangements for which authorisation is sought from legal action under the relevant provisions of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* while the ACCC considers and evaluates the merits of the application.

On 25 March 2021, the ACCC decided to grant conditional interim authorisation. A copy of the ACCC decision is **attached** and available on the [ACCC Public Register](#).

Interim authorisation commences immediately and remains in place until it is revoked, the date the ACCC's final determination comes into effect or the date on which the application for authorisation is withdrawn.

### **Making a submission**

To inform the ACCC's consideration about whether to grant substantive authorisation to allow cooperation among the supermarkets in response to the COVID-19 pandemic to

continue until 31 March 2022, the ACCC now invites you to make a submission on the substantive application for authorisation. In making your submission, please provide information, evidence and views about the likely public benefits, effects on competition and any other public detriment that you consider will result from the Proposed Conduct.

If you intend to provide a submission, please do so by **22 April 2021**. If you wish to request an extension, please contact us on the details below as early as possible. Submissions after the due date (or after any extension granted) may not be taken into account.
