## 1. Material contracts, arrangements, understandings or decisions that rely on the Authorisation

No material contract, arrangement or understanding that relies on the Authorisation was entered into during the Reporting Period.

The following decisions that rely on the Authorisation were made during the Reporting Period:

- a) The following meetings of Victorian industry participants occurred during the Reporting Period:
  - i. A meeting between representatives of AEMO, AGL, AusNet, Basslink, Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (**DEWLP**), Energy Australia and Origin was held on Friday 6 November 2020. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss any potential issues that may arise in relation to maintenance or scheduled outages in Victoria, and the resources required, in light of COVID-19. The participants shared information relating to the timing of current and proposed maintenance, including the upcoming outages of the 500kV transmission lines to South Australia.
  - ii. A meeting between representatives of AEMO, Alinta, AusNet, Basslink, DEWLP, Energy Australia and Origin was held on Friday 13 November 2020. A representative of the ACCC attended as an observer. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss any potential issues that may arise in relation to maintenance or scheduled outages in Victoria, and the resources required, in light of COVID-19. The participants shared information relating to the timing of current and proposed maintenance, including the upcoming outages of the 500kV transmission lines to South Australia.
  - iii. A meeting between representatives of AEMO, AusNet, Basslink, DEWLP, Energy Australia and Origin was held on Friday 27 November 2020. The participants shared information relating to the timing of current and proposed maintenance.
  - ii. A meeting between representatives of AEMO, DNRME, CleanCo, CS Energy, InterGen, Origin and Millmerran Power was held on Friday 27 November. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss any potential issues that may arise in relation to maintenance or scheduled outages in Queensland, and the resources required, in light of COVID-19. The participants shared information relating to the timing of current and proposed maintenance.

c) A meeting of South Australian industry participants was held on Friday 20 November. Representatives of the following organisations attended: AEMO, AGL, Department for Energy and Mining (South Australia), ElectraNet, Engie, Infigin, Neoen, Origin, Synergen and Tesla. A representative of the ACCC attended as an observer. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss any potential issues that may arise in relation to maintenance or scheduled outages in South Australia, and the resources required, in light of COVID-19 and the lock-down recently announced by the South Australian Government. The participants shared information relating to the timing of current and proposed maintenance.
