Notification of Exclusive Dealing – RAMS Home Loans (N91066)

I refer to the above third line forcing notification lodged by RAMS Home Loans Pty Limited (RAMS) on 28 January 2003 with the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the Commission). Legal immunity from the Trade Practices Act 1974 (the Act) commences on 11 February 2003. This notification has been placed on the Commission's public register.

The notified conduct is described as RAMS providing franchise services to businesses wishing to operate RAMS Home Loan Centres on the condition that franchisees acquire goods or services from specified third parties. The products and suppliers specified were set out in the covering submission and attached table to the notification. The products and suppliers specified are:

The products to be tied are:

- Project management services provided by Clifton Coney Stevens Pty Limited in relation to the construction of the RAMS Home Loan Centres.
- Printing services from "Moore" in relation to stationary and marketing material.
- Business cards from J Saunders & Sons Pty Limited.
- Promotional material such as pens, polo shirts, toys etc from SK Corporate Marketing.
- Graphics such as in-store posters and marketing material from Tibet Group Pty Limited.
- RAMS uniforms from SF Corporate Clothing.
- Supply of and installing of signage from Gadsden Signs.
- Printing of RAMS materials such as brochures, letterhead, envelopes and standard forms from Penfold Buscombe Ltd.
- Printing of stationary for local area marketing from SNAP instant printing.
- Computer hardware, cabling and servicing from Unisys Credit Services.



On the basis of the information that you have provided, it is not intended that further action be taken in this matter at this stage.

Please note that the Commission may act to remove the immunity afforded by this notification at a later stage if it is satisfied that the likely benefit to the public from the conduct will not outweigh the likely detriment to the public from the conduct.
