Authorisation applications lodged by Bartter Enterprises Pty Ltd, La Ionica Operations Pty, Baiada Poultry Pty Ltd, Inghams Enterprises Pty Ltd & Hazeldene Chicken Farm Pty Ltd

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the Commission) has received five applications for authorisation from Bartter Enterprises Pty Ltd (A90901), La Ionica Operations Pty (A90902), Hazeldene Chicken Farm Pty Ltd (A90903), Inghams Enterprises Pty Ltd (A90904) & Baiada Poultry Pty Ltd (A90905) (collectively referred to as 'the processors').

By way of background, the Commission is the Commonwealth agency responsible for administering the *Trade Practices Act 1974* (the Act). A key objective of the Act is to prevent anti-competitive conduct, thereby encouraging competition and efficiency in business, resulting in a greater choice for consumers in price, quality and service.

The Act, however, recognises that competition may not always be in the public interest. It therefore allows the Commission to grant immunity from the Act for anti-competitive conduct in certain circumstances.

One way businesses may obtain immunity is to apply for what is known as an 'authorisation' from the Commission. Broadly, the Commission may 'authorise' businesses to engage in anti-competitive conduct where it is satisfied that the public benefit from the conduct outweighs any detriment to the public constituted by any lessening of competition. The Commission conducts a comprehensive public consultation process before making a decision to grant or deny authorisation.

Application for authorisation

Broadly, the applicants seek authorisation to enable the giving of effect to contracts already negotiated between individual Victorian chicken meat processors and their growers acting collectively and to allow proposed or future contracts to be negotiated.

Specifically, each of the applications is made by the processors for their role in future collective negotiations with their respective growers. In the case of two processors, Bartter and Baiada, the applications are also made by them for their role in giving effect to existing collectively negotiated agreements. Bartter's and La Ionica's applications are also made on behalf of (some) growers who have consented to the applications being made on their behalf. In the case of the consenting Bartter growers, authorisation is sought by the growers for their role in future collective negotiations with Bartter's and in giving effect to existing collectively negotiated agreements. In the case of the consenting La Ionica grower, authorisation is sought by it for its role in future collective negotiations with La Ionica.

However, the list of interested parties the Commission has consulted is not exhaustive. Of course the Commission would be happy to receive a submission from any grower or other interested party who has not been formally consulted. I would encourage you to pass on a copy of this letter to any interested party not consulted directly by the Commission who you consider may wish to lodge a submission commenting on the applications.

GUIDELINES FOR CONFIDENTIALITY CLAIMS Authorisations

The process whereby the Commission assesses applications for authorisation is very public, transparent and consultative. The *Trade Practices Act 1974* (the Act) requires the Commission to maintain a public register in respect of authorisation applications.

Applicants and interested parties can request that a submission, or a part of a submission, be excluded from the public register.

The Commission is required under the Act to exclude from the public register upon request details of:

- (i) secret formulae or processes;
- (ii) the cash consideration offered for the acquisition of shares in the capital of a body corporate or assets of a person; or
- (iii) the current manufacturing, producing or marketing costs of goods or services.

The Commission also has the discretion, under s 89 of the Act, to exclude material from the public register if it is satisfied that it is desirable to do so, either by reason of the confidential nature of the material or for any other reason. The Commission expects that a party claiming confidentiality on these grounds will present a case for its treatment in this manner.

Under Regulation 24 of the *Trade Practices Regulations*, when a request for confidentiality is made to the Commission:

- (a) where the request is that a whole document be excluded, the words "Restriction of Publication Claimed" should appear in red writing near the top of each page; and
- (b) where the request is that part of a document be excluded, the words "Restriction of Publication of Part Claimed" should appear in red near the top of the first page of each document, and the part for which confidentiality is claimed should also be marked in red. A submission of more than 5 pages should also include a description of the whereabouts of the parts for which confidentiality is claimed.

However, even if a document does not meet these technical requirements, the Commission may still grant confidentiality where, in the Commission's view, it is desirable to do so.

If the Commission denies a confidentiality request, the requesting party may ask that the material be returned. As a matter of practice, the Commission will specify a period (usually 14 days) in which they can request the return of such material. Upon response, the Commission will return the original material and destroy all associated copies. The Commission will not consider this material when reaching its decision.

If the Commission does not receive a response within the specified period, the original material will be placed on the public register.

Information or documents granted confidentiality may be used by the Commission pursuant to its powers generally under the *Trade Practices Act*.
