THIRD LINE FORCING NOTIFICATIONS NUMBER N91357, N91358, N91359 LODGED BY SERVCO PTY LIMITED, AGL ELECTRICITY LIMITED, AGL RETAIL ENERGY LIMITED

I refer to the above notifications and to your letter of 8 April 2004 addressed to Ms Liza Carver of Gilbert & Tobin.

The ACCC granted legal immunity in respect of the above notifications on 27 February 2004 in respect of the following conduct:

- (a) ancillary services and/or energy appliances to residential customers at certain discounts, allowances, rebates or credits on the condition that customers acquire both natural gas and/or electricity from AGL Retail Energy Limited and/or AGL Electricity Limited, and
- (b) certain discounts, allowances, rebates or credits on the cost of ancillary services or energy appliances on the condition that customers require energy from AGL Retail Energy Limited and/or AGL Electricity Limited.

To date, the notifications have not been revoked.

Servco Pty Limited, AGL Electricity Limited and AGL Retail Energy Limited wish to provide ancillary services to residential customers at a discount, allowance, rebate or credit which may include a benefit of a non-monetary nature, for example, priority scheduling or extended labour warranty period, provided the customer acquires both AUST. COMPETITION & CONSUMER COMMISSION

natural gas and/or electricity from AGL Retail Energy Limited and/or AGL Electricity Limited.

It is our view that such non-monetary benefits are either within the ambit of the existing conduct granted immunity under the above notifications or such non-monetary benefits simply reflect an improved customer service to those customers.

For the sake of certainty, we wish to draw to your attention the proposed non-monetary benefits and request that such conduct is considered to be within the general immunity granted by the ACCC in the above notifications.

If the ACCC takes a different view, please let us know.
