# COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA TRADE PRACTICES ACT 1974 - Subsection 93(1) EXCLUSIVE DEALING NOTIFICATION

### TO THE AUSTRALIAN COMPETITION & CONSUMER COMMISSION:

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with subsection 93(1) of the *Trade Practices Act* 1974, of particulars of conduct or proposed conduct of a kind referred to in subsection 47(6) or (7) of that Act in which the person giving notice engages or proposes to engage.

### (b) Short description of business carried on by that person:

Fuji supplies a wide range of retail camera and film products, and provides related services including photo imaging, film processing, etc.

## 2. (a) Description of the goods or services in relation to the supply or acquisition of which this notice relates:

Broadband and narrowband internet services and associated products and services supplied by Telstra Corporation Limited of 242 Exhibition Street, Melbourne, Victoria, 3000 ("Telstra") from time to time including its BigPond ADSL service, BigPond Cable service and BigPond Satellite service and associated internet starter packs and self-installation kits ("BigPond Services").

Products and services supplied by Fuji from time to time including photo imaging services ("Fuji Services").

### (b) Description of the conduct or proposed conduct:

For limited promotional periods, Fuji proposes to:

- (i) give or allow or offer to give or allow a discount, allowance, rebate or credit in relation to a Fuji Service to customers on the condition that the customer acquires or agrees to acquire a BigPond Service; and
- (ii) refuse to give or allow or offer to give or allow a discount, allowance, rebate or credit in relation to a Fuji Service for the reason that the customer has not acquired or has not agreed to acquire a BigPond Service.

### Example of the proposed conduct

The proposed conduct will be of benefit to the public as it will:

- promote competition in relevant markets by encouraging competitors of both Fuji and Telstra to offer similar benefits;
- reduce the costs of customers who may be otherwise unable to negotiate benefits in relation to Fuji Services and BigPond Services on their own behalf; and
- provide customers with the opportunity to obtain the BigPond Services with additional inclusions.

The proposed conduct will not substantially lessen competition because:

- customers will be able to acquire Fuji Services at the usual retail price without acquiring any goods or services from Telstra;
- customers will be able to acquire the BigPond Services at the usual retail price without acquiring any goods or services from Fuji;
- customers may acquire the relevant products and services from a range of other suppliers;
- the number of persons potentially affected by the proposed conduct is insignificant compared to the total number of customers who acquire Fuji Services and BigPond Services; and
- competition in the markets for retail camera and film products and services and broadband internet services is vigorous and there are many suppliers in these markets.

The applicant believes that the benefits from the proposed conduct outlined above will outweigh any possible detriment considered to arise from the conduct.


