# Application for revocation of authorisation A90745 and substitute by replacement authorisation A90972 lodged by Premium Milk Ltd

I refer to the abovementioned application for revocation and substitution lodged with the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) by Premium Milk Ltd (Premium). The proposed substitute authorisation (A90972) seeks to continue to allow the collective bargaining of farm-gate prices and milk standards through the representative body – Premium – in direct negotiations with Parmalat (formerly Pauls) for a further period of five years.

In short, the ACCC considers that the public benefits which may arise from the proposed collective bargaining arrangements are likely to outweigh the potential anti-competitive detriments of the proposed arrangements. Consequently, the ACCC has issued a draft determination which proposes to grant Premium's application for a substitute authorisation.

A copy of the ACCC's draft determination is attached.
