I refer to the abovementioned project and advise as follows:

Conditions - ACCC Clause

Because the buyer is obliged to enter into a building contract with a specified builder the sale constitutes exclusive dealing within the meaning of section 47 of the *Trade Practices Act 1974*. Broadly, exclusive dealing involves one person who trades with another imposing restrictions on the other's freedom to choose with whom or in what it deals if the conduct has the purpose or effect of substantially lessening competition.

If notification is given to the ACCC pursuant to section 93 of the Act for exclusive dealing conduct other than third line forcing immediately being on the date that the notification is lodged.


The notification must be given on a prescribed form and a fee paid.
