## Collective bargaining notification CB00006 lodged by the Wangaratta Anaesthesia Group on 21 November 2007

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has received the above collective bargaining notification lodged by a group of anaesthetists who are members of the Wangaratta Anaesthesia Group, proposing to collectively negotiate with HBA in relation to anaesthesia fees. Specifically, the group proposes to collectively negotiate a value above the scheduled fee for the provision of no-gap billing to members of the HBA Fund.

The ACCC invites you to comment on the notification as the target of the proposed collective bargaining group. Enclosed is a summary of the collective bargaining notification process.

## Request for submission

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed collective arrangements. In making your submission, you may wish to focus on the types of benefits and detriments set out in the enclosure.

In addition, the ACCC would appreciate if you could provide the following information:

- details of HBA's Ezyclaim scheme and how it compares with other funds' no-gap arrangements;
- HBA's share of private health insurance membership in Victoria; and details of the current relationship with the Wangaratta Anaesthesia Group
