**Having studied the whole submission by RWWA to the ACCC, I find the ideas and reasons for their submission totally unacceptable and misleading. Further, RWWA has made statements that are untrue, in particular :**

**P.6 PUBLIC BENEFIT ITEMS.**

**5.7 "RWWA understands that some trainers have neglected to take out workers' compensation insurance" How then did they obtain or renew their trainer's licence?**

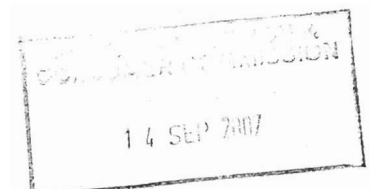
**5.6, 5.7, 5.8, 5.9. No evidence at all. Jockeys, track riders, strappers, etc., can and have their own insurers, or can remain with cover under their trainer's cover.**

**P.3. 2. BACKGROUND**

**2.4 RWWA'S submission is incorrect. My right to "shop around" will be eroded and they have no statutory right to intrude into my business.**

**It is my opinion that RWWA should service the industry in its own internal affairs and not intrude any further than that.**


