Applications for authorisation regarding Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal - interested party consultation

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has received applications for authorisation from eight coal producers using the Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal. The ACCC invites you to comment on the application. Attached is a summary of the authorisation process including how to make a submission to the ACCC.

The applicants are seeking authorisation for 'a maximum six month extension of the Authorisation granted by the ACCC in relation to the Queue Management System which expires on 31 December 2008'. The arrangements were most recently authorised by the ACCC on 29 February 2008 (authorisations A91060-A91062).

A full copy of the application for authorisation will be available shortly on the ACCC's website <<u>www.accc.gov.au</u>>.

Interim authorisation

The applicants have requested interim authorisation to continue operating the current queue management system following the expiry of authorisations A91060-A91062 on 31 December 2008.

The ACCC endeavours to deal with requests for interim authorisation quickly. In making an assessment as to whether it is appropriate to grant interim authorisation, the ACCC is not required to undertake a full assessment of the benefit and detriment likely to arise as a result of the proposed conduct.

The ACCC decides whether to grant interim authorisation on a case by case basis. Should an applicant request interim authorisation, the ACCC will usually consider a range of factors, including harm to the applicant and other parties if interim is or is not granted, possible benefit and detriment to the public, the urgency of the matter and whether the market would be able to return to substantially its pre-interim state if the ACCC should later deny authorisation.

Request for submissions

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to the applicant's application for interim authorisation, please do so by 28 November 2008.

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to the applicant's application for authorisation, please do so by 12 December 2008.

Alternatively, if you would like to provide comments orally, please contact Shane Chisholm on (02) 6243 1252 to organise a suitable time.

Submissions, including oral submissions, will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion (guidelines are attached).

Timetable

The ACCC will progress its assessment of the application in a timely manner. An indicative timetable is set out below for your information.

28 November 2008	Closing date for submissions on interim authorisation.
3 December 2008	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process regarding interim authorisation.

12 December 2008	Closing date for submissions from interested parties.
December 2008	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process.
January-February 2009	Draft determination.
March 2009	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
April 2009	Final determination.
