I very concerned with the above subject. I have sent my concerns to the ACCC in an earlier correspondence and have been referred to this email address.

I feel by not allowing customers choice in the method of payment is anti competitive. By removing the freedom to choose method of payment will lead to fees. Currently I can choose to Pay COD, Check, Bank transfer etc. At the moment I can choose if I want more security in payment (more costs) or no fees with COD etc. I feel this is a guise for profit tiering not a security reason. I'm protected under Australian law if I have a problem with a seller or buyer. I have in the past had a problem with a seller where I did not receive the goods. I still haven't got my money back and its not worth the effort for \$17.00, but there are big problems with Ebay's policies, ie in relation to the fore mentioned I was unable to give any type of feed back on the seller which could worn others and I was un able to speak to any living person at Ebay in regards to this. I feel all my correspondence to Ebay has been dealt with by auto response generated by computers. If Ebay is going to move into this type of monopoly it needs to provide people with ability to contact them.
