I have read the draft notice sent by the Chairman of the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (“the Commission”) to eBay International AG (“eBay”) following their application for exemption under the exclusive dealing provisions of the Trade Practices Act 1974 (“the Act”) and the reply from the solicitors for eBay.

I do not see that the reply on behalf of eBay responds to the concerns raised by the Commission. Further, there is ample evidence on the eBay web site that the interim measures recommended by the Commission have not been fully adopted.

I wholeheartedly concur with the reasons set out by the Commission in its draft notice of 12th. June, 2008 to eBay and I urge the Commission to maintain its view that eBay’s conduct raises serious competition concerns and is not in the public interest.

The Australian public is very proud of this country and our joint ability, through legislation, to exercise freedom of choice. As one eBay member who wishes to retain this freedom of choice I congratulate you on your stance to date and I trust that our “Australian Consumer Watch Dog” uses every means at its disposal to prevent eBay’s notification from achieving its objective.
