To whom it may concern,

I fully support the intention of the ACCC to revoke Ebay's immunity from prosecution, the draft notice of which was published on 12th June 2008. I would like to point out that Ebay are persisting in enforcing the First Stage of the 'Project' (forcing all sellers to accept paypal payments), indeed they have effectively been enforcing part of it since 17th January 2007 when, without informing the ACCC, they forced new sellers to accept paypal as a form of payment.

As the original submissions showed, there is no evidence that paypal is overall a safer method of payment than bank deposit, money order etc and that any possible advantage in paypal for buyers (those that remain as ebay buyers - many of my buyers have indicated that they would never use paypal) is far outweighed by the huge disadvantages that sellers face and the reduction in competition to other payment methods. I look forward to the ACCC finally revoking Ebay's immunity from prosecution.

I am happy for this submission to be placed on the public register.
