**Application for authorisation A91088 lodged by the Australian Medical Association (NSW) Limited - - final determination**

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has issued a determination in respect of the application for authorisation lodged by the Australian Medical Association (NSW) Limited (AMA NSW) on 22 April 2008.

A copy of the ACCC's determination is attached, including a summary of its reasons. For the reasons set out in chapter 5 of its determination, the ACCC has decided to grant authorisation, until 31 December 2013, for AMA NSW to collectively negotiate with:

- NSW Health the standard terms and conditions, including rates of remuneration, of contracts for visiting medical officers (VMOs) engaged in the NSW public hospital system
- public health organisations (PHOs) in NSW (as set out in Attachment A to the determination) on issues relevant to the engagement by VMOs by PHOs but excluding standard VMO contract terms and conditions and rates of remuneration.

The proposed authorisation does not extend to any collective decision by current or future VMOs in the NSW public hospital system to engage in collective boycott activities.

**Application for review**

Pursuant to section 101 of the *Trade Practices Act 1974*, a person dissatisfied with this determination may apply to the Australian Competition Tribunal for its review. An application for review must be made within 21 days of the date of this determination; that is, on or before 3 September 2008. If no application to review is lodged by this date, the ACCC's determination will come into force on 4 September 2008.

An application for review of the ACCC's determination should be lodged directly with the Australian Competition Tribunal. The Australian Competition Tribunal is a separate body from the ACCC and is located within the Federal Court of Australia.
