The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has issued a determination in respect of the applications for authorisation lodged by the Newcastle Port Corporation (NPC) on 4 December 2007 and the applications for authorisation lodged by Donaldson Coal Pty Limited on 7 December 2007.

NPC and Donaldson sought authorisation of a Proposed System to address the imbalance between the demand for coal loading services at the Port of Newcastle and the capacity of the Hunter Valley coal chain in 2008. NPC and Donaldson have indicated that the Proposed System is, in all material respects, consistent with the Medium Term Capacity Balancing System (CBS) which expired on 31 December 2007.

A copy of the ACCC's determination is attached, including a summary of its reasons. For the reasons set out in its determination, the ACCC has decided to grant authorisation until 31 December 2008. The ACCC's assessment is set out in Chapter 6 of its determination.

## Application for review

Pursuant to section 101 of the Trade Practices Act 1974, a person dissatisfied with this determination may apply to the Australian Competition Tribunal for its review. An application for review must be made within 21 days of the date of this determination; that is, on or before 14 May 2008. If no application to review is lodged by this date, the ACCC's determination will come into force on 15 May 2008.

An application for review of the ACCC's determination should be lodged directly with the Australian Competition Tribunal, The Australian Competition Tribunal is a separate body from the ACCC and is located within the Federal Court of Australia.
