Applications for authorisation [A91147-A91149 and A91168-A91169] lodged by PWCS, NCIG and NPC - interim authorisation revoked

I refer to the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission's (the ACCC) interim authorisation decisions of 22 and 29 July 2009 in relation to the above mentioned applications for authorisation.

In particular, the ACCC granted interim authorisation to the Capacity Framework Arrangements (except for section 11 of Part B) on condition that the Applicants execute their respective Capacity Framework Documents by 31 August 2009.

On 31 August 2009 the Applicants advised the ACCC that one party failed to execute the relevant Capacity Framework Documents.

Accordingly, on 1 September the ACCC revoked interim authorisation of the Capacity Framework Arrangements.

Next steps

The applications for authorisation are still before the ACCC for its consideration. I note that it is open for the Applicants to continue to seek to negotiate any outstanding issues and to request interim authorisation again in the event that all of the Capacity Framework Documents are executed in the future.

Further, I note that the Applicants foreshadowed the possibility of varying the current arrangements if all of the parties failed to execute the Capacity Framework Documents by the deadline. This could involve some of the parties lodging a new application for authorisation with the ACCC.
