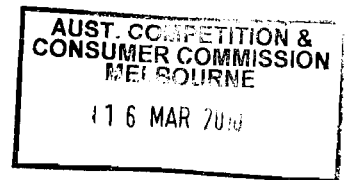

If there is no other way then we support the V.F.F. application.

However it must be said that the destruction of the previous Victorian Broiler Industry Negotiating Committee (VBINC) has proved a gross waste of time for everyone – 5 years and still no signed contract.

Smaller processors worry that they may include conditions or payment in excess of others; growers that may be overcome by difficult or harsh contract conditions.

Smaller grower groups & their negotiators need to not only run their farm, but find time to negotiate, when they are available the processor may not be.

The broiler industry is unlike a 5 day a week factory, it runs 24/7 year round regardless of holidays, with night pick-ups & week end work.

It would be more to the point if V.B.I.N.C. was reinstated & A.C.C.C. kept an eye on that, but if not we support the V.F.F. application.
