TCGA held a meeting with all its current members the purpose of this meeting was to discuss the proposed collective bargaining arrangement and to seek members consent to lodge a collective bargaining notification on their behalf, please find attached a copy of the minutes of this meeting. No, it is however a continuation of an ACCC authorisation which expires in December 2009, the Target is the same, the group is the same but the group now has different members.

Inghams Enterprises Pty Limited - 82 Main Rd, Sorell TAS 7172. An appropriate contact is Mr Les Hadley Group Manager operations Tasmania. The target is aware of this application. The target is a vertically integrated chicken meat processor that operates in Tasmania and nationally.

(b) Provide a description of the goods or services which the participants of the collective bargaining arrangements (listed at 2 (a) above) propose to supply to or acquire from the target:

Inghams provide young chickens to TCGA members who grow them for a growing fee then Inghams process and market the grown chickens, the collective bargaining is to negotiate terms and conditions of the process.

(c) Do the participants of the proposed collective bargaining arrangements (see 2 (a) above) reasonably expect to make one or more contracts with the target about the supply to or acquisition from the target of one or more of the goods or services (listed at 3 (b) above)?

Yes, the TCGA members expect to make one contract with Inghams relating to terms and conditions of growing chickens.

Each member is currently providing services to the target (Inghams) under a current agreement negotiated under the ACCC Authorisation and each member entered into that agreement within the last 5 years.

Under the proposed collective bargaining arrangemnt TCGA proposes to negotiate on behalf of its members with Inghams the Terms & Conditions and fee for growing their chickens.

Members would not be compelled to have TCGA negotiate on their behalf and would remain free to opt out of the proposed arrangement and negotiate individually with Inghams.

The proposed collective bargaining arrangement will not

involve a collective boycott.

TCGA propose to negotiate on behalf of its members a growing fee.

TCGA does not propose to engage in conduct which relates to an exclusionary provision. In the event that agreement cannot be reached through collective bargaining with Inghams individual agreements will be pursued by the participants of the group.

There are two principal markets relevant to this notification, these being the market for contract chicken growing services and the market for processed chicken meat.

Market for Chicken Growing Services

There is one major chicken meat processors operating within the general vicinity of Hobart - Inghams Enterprises Pty Limited. The only other processor is Nichols Poultry.

Inghams is a fully integrated business which include hatcheries, breeding farms and processing plant. Inghams also has its own feed mill operation. Inghams is a national business having operations in several other states and a significant share of the national market for chicken meat. Nichols has a small share of the local market.

Most of the chickens grown for processors are contract grown by individual contracted growers, but there are some company owned farms.

Processors will normally operate only one processing plant in a state. In Tasmania the processing plant is located not far distant from Hobart and Inghams plant is at Sorell. A processors contracted growers will normally be reasonably proximate to the processors processing plant and associated feed mills to minimise transport costs of feed and day old chicks, and pick up costs. Issues of quality of grown birds also arise in relation to distances transported. The participants in the proposed collective bargaining are Inghams contracted growers in Tasmania.

Growers are contracted exclusively to one processor and demands for grower services will be largely affected by the demand for product at that processors plant in the relevant state.

Market for Processed Chicken Meat

The large supermarket chains and the food service industry are the major market outlets.

Very little product is sold under set period contracts or with fixed prices. As a result processors have traditionally had a strong focus on production costs and prices.

5. Public detriments

(a) What will be the likely effect of the notified conduct on the prices of the goods or services described at 3 (b) above and the prices of goods or services in other affected markets? In answering this question please provide facts and information to support the claims made:

It is possible that the proposed collective bargaining arrangements will result in costs to the processor represented by growing fees being higher than if contracts were individually negotiated with growers.

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission has previously recognised the public benefits of collective bargaining by chicken growers with processors in South Australia, and Victoria as well as Tasmania.

It is submitted that the public benefits of the proposed collective bargaining arrangements outweigh the public detriments.

If the collective bargaining arrangements are authorised, it will improve TCGA's bargaining position in relation to prices and conditions, currently it is weak due to the lack of processors in Tasmania, it also improves communication between the processor and the grower which results in a higher standard of facility to enhance animal health and well being. There is also a saveing of resources and time in the negotiating period.
