Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines - applications for authorisation A91267 & A91268 - interested party consultation

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has received applications for authorisation from Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines. The ACCC invites you to comment on the applications. Attached is a summary of the authorisation process including how to make a submission to the ACCC.

Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines are seeking authorisation for a proposed alliance in relation to international passenger transport services. The proposed alliance comprises an 'Alliance Framework Agreement', and includes:

- freesale codeshare agreements
- a special prorate agreement
- reciprocal frequent flyer and lounge agreements.

Under the alliance, the Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines will fully cooperate on all aspects of their Australia-Singapore services and any international and domestic connecting routes, including joint pricing, scheduling, marketing and sales. The airlines will cooperate in relation to the marketing of services to corporate and government accounts, including joint bidding and joint pricing.

Virgin Australia and Singapore Airlines do not intend to share revenues at this stage, however, will possibly implement metal neutral policies in the event the airlines begin operating any overlapping routes in future or agree to jointly deploy new services.

Request for submissions

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements. In particular the ACCC would appreciate your views on the following issues:

- the impact that the authorised alliance is likely to have on competition on Australia—Singapore services and connecting international routes and/or domestic routes
- the likely public benefits of the proposed alliance

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to the applications for authorisation, please do so by 15 July 2011.

Submissions, including oral submissions, will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion (guidelines are attached).
