The franchisees of the franchise system and associate member of the franchise system ("Associate Member") whose consents are provided in Schedule 3.

(b) Description of business carried on by the applicant:

BFC in its own right and through franchisees operates a chain of Paint and Decorator Stores that provide expertise to both retail customers and trade painters Australia wide.

The Associate Member of the franchise system operates an independent paint and decorator store that provides expertise to both retail customers and trade painters in South Melbourne, utilising a similar system to the BFC franchise system.

BFC owned stores, franchisee owned stores and the Associate Member retail architectural and decorative paint and coatings products and related accessory products to customers in Australia.

The various stores are categorised into BFC owned stores, franchisee owned stores and the Associate Member store.

(c) Is the representative of the applicant lodging the notice a trade union, an officer of a trade union or a person acting on the direction of a trade union?

BFC Stores Pty Ltd (ACN 127 825 727) of 390B Queens Parade, Clifton Hill, VIC 3068 on behalf of its BFC owned stores.

BFC has signed this notification form on page 6.

Each of the franchisees and Associate Member identified in Schedule 2 have provided their consent to the lodgement of the notification on their behalf and these are attached in Schedule 3.

BFC Stores Pty Ltd (ACN 127 825 727) is the applicant of the initial notification. The initial notification was lodged by BFC and related to an arrangement between BFC and 3M Australia Pty Ltd. An additional 46 notifications (including this notification) were lodged for similar arrangements which concern conduct in the same market and for which a concessional fee is claimed.

All 47 related notifications were lodged on the same date being, 6 October 2011.

At this stage, no registration number is known.

Section B – collective bargaining arrangements

3. Proposed collective bargaining arrangements

The target business is Melpaint Products Pty Ltd trading as Dispose-A-Tray of PO Box 119, Ringwood, VIC, 3134 (the Target).

The Target makes moulds/inserts that can be put into plastic paint trays and then disposed of immediately afterwards without having to wash the paint tray.

(b) Provide a description of the goods or services which the participants of the collective bargaining arrangements (listed at 2 (a) above) propose to supply to or acquire from the target:

See Schedule 4 for list of products (the Products)

(c) Do the participants of the proposed collective bargaining arrangements (see 2 (a) above) reasonably expect to make one or more contracts with the target about the supply to or acquisition from the target of one or more of the goods or services (listed at 3 (b) above)?

Yes.

(d) In relation to (c) above, provide details of the basis upon which that expectation is held including details of past contracts with the target:

BFC entered into a contract with the Target in May 2008 for the supply of the Products.

(e) Do the participants of the collective bargaining arrangements (listed at 2 (a) above) reasonably expect that contractual payments between the target and each participant will not exceed \$3 million (or any other amount prescribed by regulation) in any 12 month period, and on what basis?

Yes, BFC expects that the contractual payments between the Target and each participant will not exceed \$3 million in any 12 month period. This is based on:

- (i) previous experience and the historical volumes BFC stores have purchased in the past; and
- (ii) forecasted supplier sales and rebate figures.
- (f) In relation to (e) above provide an estimation of the contractual payments expected between the target and each participant in relation to the goods and services (listed at 2 (a) above):

BFC reasonably expects that total contractual payments between the target and each participant will not exceed \$3,000,000.00.

- (g) Provide a description of the collective bargaining arrangements proposed including, but not limited to:
 - (i) the process by which participants propose to undertake collective bargaining with the target; and
 - (ii) the type of terms and conditions expected to be negotiated in collective bargaining arrangements (for example: price; non-price conditions of supply such as contract periods etc); and

After consultation with a representative group of franchise store owners, BFC proposes to negotiate on behalf of the BFC owned, franchisee owned stores and the Associate Member with the Target in relation to the price at which the BFC owned stores, franchisee owned stores and the Associate Member can be supplied or acquire the Products from the Target for onsupply to Australian consumers. Through that process all of the competitors aim to realise the best price for supply or acquisition.

BFC does not propose to engage in conduct which relates to an exclusionary provision.

The market in the present notification is the national market for the retailing of architectural and decorative paint and coatings products and related accessory products. The affected suppliers will be the other suppliers of such products and accessories. However, the effect will be negligible considering there is a high number of such suppliers in the market.

5. Public detriments

(a) What will be the likely effect of the notified conduct on the prices of the goods or services described at 3 (b) above and the prices of goods or services in other affected markets? In answering this question please provide facts and information to support the claims made:

There will be little detriment to the public as a result of this notification, as the market is highly competitive.

There is voluntary participation in this arrangement. The individual stores can choose to individually negotiate directly with suppliers.

(b) What other detriments may result from the notified conduct? In answering this question please provide facts and information to support the claims made:

None.

The proposed conduct is likely to have the following benefits to the public by:

- providing individual stores with access to architectural and decorative paint and coatings accessory products at competitive prices;
- (ii) Australian consumers will benefit from the proposed arrangement as they will obtain lower retail prices for the Products;
- (iii) providing BFC owned stores, franchisee owned stores and the Associate Member with a competitive advantage in the market;
- (iv) there are a large number of suppliers of accessory products for architectural and decorative paint products in the market. The proposed arrangement will facilitate competition in the market, and it may encourage other competitors to offer similar discounts.

(v) the BFC franchisees would be new entrants into the market for the retailing of architectural and decerative paint and coatings products and related accessory products.

SCHEDULE 1

Under the proposed collective bargaining arrangement, BFC will enter into a Supplier Trading Terms Agreement with the Target.

As mentioned in paragraph 1(b) of this notification, BFC operates a chain of retail stores and the Associate Member operates a retail store that retail architectural and decorative paint and coatings products and related accessory products to Australian customers. The Target is a supplier of such accessory products, namely the Products.

BFC, after consulting with a representative group of its franchisees and the Associate Member, will enter into negotiations with the Target to supply architectural and decorative paint and coating products to the BFC owned stores, franchisee owned stores and the Associate Member on the terms of the Supplier Trading Terms Agreement.

BFC operates the various stores under different arrangements, namely BFC owned stores and franchisee owned stores. The Associate Member operates its store under a similar system to the BFC franchisees however independently of the BFC franchise system. Since each store individually would be unable to reach the scale to compete effectively with large companies, this arrangement serves the purpose of BFC negotiating with the Target to supply related accessory products to the BFC owned stores, franchisee owned stores and the Associate Member at a discounted price. BFC will receive a rebate for this.

This arrangement is beneficial for the individual stores because BFC are able to negotiate for them collectively to achieve economies of scale not available to each specific entity.

Each franchisee and the Associate Member is not compelled to have BFC negotiate on their behalf and would be free to negotiate individually with the supplier at any time.
