Dear Pamela,

My business supplies soccer uniforms (playing shirts, shorts, socks) to schools and soccer clubs on the Gold Coast and Northern NSW. The quality of my teamwear is good enough to be the preferred supplier for last 3 years to the premier high school Sports Excellence program ([redacted]), and the Northern NSW Independent Schools Association. I also provide soccer uniforms to Footy Japan in Tokyo (a 60 team league).

The difference in price between what I sell to schools, Footy Japan, or soccer clubs in northern NSW versus what Gold Coast soccer clubs pay for their uniforms from the licenced suppliers is somewhere between ten and twenty dollars per uniform.

Given there are estimated to be over 60,000 registered players in Queensland, at a minimum saving per club of \$10 per player, that is over \$600,000 pa loss to the clubs. Meanwhile Football Qld only makes around \$250,000 pa from its licencing agreement. Surely it would be better to impose a \$4-5 per player per annum levy.

I prefer that my details be suppressed from the public register.
