St Vincent's Health Australia & Ors application for authorisation (A91295 - A91297) - Final Determination

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has issued a determination in respect of the applications for authorisation lodged by St Vincent's Health Australia & Ors on 23 March 2012.

The Applicants (St Vincent's Health Australia Limited, the Trustees of Mary Aikenhead Ministries, The Holy Spirit Northside Hospital and St Vincent's Private Hospital Sydney) are seeking authorisation to engage in joint negotiations by the SVHA Group with suppliers of goods and services and also with health insurers and other funding organisations as well as limiting, preventing or restricting the supply or acquisition of goods and services by any or all of the SVHA Group. The proposed conduct also includes exclusive dealing arrangements such that the supply of goods or services at St Vincent's Private Hospital is conditional on a third person acquiring goods or services from another entity in the Group.

A copy of the ACCC's determination is attached, including a summary of its reasons. For the reasons set out in its determination, the ACCC has decided to grant authorisation for ten years. The ACCC's assessment is set out in Chapter four of its determination.

Application for review

Pursuant to section 101 of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010*, a person dissatisfied with this determination may apply to the Australian Competition Tribunal for its review. An application for review must be made within 21 days of the date of this determination; that is, on or before 3 October 2012. If no application to review is lodged by this date, the ACCC's determination will come into force on 4 October 2012.

An application for review of the ACCC's determination should be lodged directly with the Australian Competition Tribunal. The Australian Competition Tribunal is a separate body from the ACCC and is located within the Federal Court of Australia.
