**Authorisation submitted by Queensland Newsagents Association  
- interested party consultation**

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has received an application for authorisation from the Queensland Newsagents Association (QNF). The ACCC invites you to comment on the application. Attached is a summary of the authorisation process including how to make a submission to the ACCC.

QNF is seeking authorisation to collectively bargain on behalf of its members with the Golden Casket Lotteries Corporation (Golden Casket), in relation to the distribution services that QNF members provide to Golden Casket.

**Interim authorisation**

QNF has also requested interim authorisation to engage in the above conduct. The ACCC endeavours to deal with requests for interim authorisation quickly. In making an assessment as to whether it is appropriate to grant interim authorisation, the ACCC is not required to undertake a full assessment of the benefit and detriment likely to arise as a result of the proposed conduct. Nevertheless, submissions in relation to interim authorisation are invited in this matter.

The ACCC decides whether to grant interim authorisation on a case by case basis. Should an applicant request interim authorisation, the ACCC will usually consider a range of factors, including harm to the applicant and other parties if interim authorisation is or is not granted, possible benefit and detriment to the public, the urgency of the matter and whether the market

would be able to return to substantially its pre-interim authorisation state if the ACCC should later deny authorisation.

### **Invitation to make a submission**

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements. If you intend to provide a submission in relation to applicant's application for authorisation or interim authorisation, please do so by **13 June 2012**. Alternatively, if you would like to provide comments orally, please contact Tanya Hobbs on 02 6243 1029 to organise a suitable time.

Submissions, including oral submissions, will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion (guidelines are attached).

### **Timetable**

<b>13 June 2012</b>	Closing date for submissions from interested parties.
<b>15 June 2012</b>	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process.
<b>Late June 2012</b>	ACCC decision regarding interim authorisation and draft determination.
<b>June/July 2012</b>	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
<b>August/September 2012</b>	Final determination.
