Virgin Australia & Air New Zealand applications for authorisation A91362 & A91363 – interested party consultation

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) is currently conducting a consultation process on an application for re-authorisation received from Virgin Australia Airlines & Air New Zealand Limited on 8 March 2013.

The purpose of this letter is to invite you, as a potentially interested party, to comment on the application. Please see the ACCC's publication <u>Authorisation process - the basics</u> for a summary of the authorisation process and how to make a submission to the ACCC.

Application for re-authorisation

Virgin Australia and Air New Zealand seek authorisation to maintain and to continue to give effect to the Australasian Airline Alliance Agreement (Alliance Agreement), an associated Code Share Agreement and related agreements which are contemplated by the Alliance Agreement. The applicants have sought re-authorisation that is unconditional and for a period of five years.

Background

The ACCC previously granted authorisation to Virgin Australia (formerly Virgin Blue) and Air New Zealand to give effect to the Alliance Agreement, subject to a condition that they maintain, and grow, a base level of capacity on the routes of concern for the term of the authorisation. The ACCC granted authorisation until 31 December 2013.

Request for submissions

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements.

Further, the ACCC invites you to outline your general experience of the alliance during the term of the previous authorisation. The ACCC would also welcome your views on the public benefits and detriments you consider have actually resulted from the alliance during the previous authorisation period, particularly in relation to enhancements of the applicants' product and service offerings, whether lower fares have resulted from the alliance, whether the alliance has resulted in a competitive response from rivals and whether the alliance has resulted in a stimulation of tourism.

The ACCC also invites interested parties to comment on the applicants request that reauthorisation be granted without the current condition (that they maintain, and grow, a base level of capacity).

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to this application please provide it by **12 April 2013**.

Submissions, including oral submissions, will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion. Please see the ACCC's publication <u>Guidelines for excluding information from the public register</u>.

Timetable

The ACCC will progress its assessment of the application in a timely manner. An indicative timetable is set out below for your information.

26 April 2013	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process.

June/July 2013	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
August/September 2013	Final determination.
