Etihad Airways PJSC & Alitalia applications for authorisation A91468 & A91469 – interested party consultation

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) is currently conducting a consultation process on applications for authorisation received from Etihad Airways PJSC & Alitalia (the Applicants) on 6 November 2014.

The Applicants are seeking authorisation for ten years for the provisions of their co-operation agreement which relate to various matters including the scheduling and pricing of international air transport services (the Proposed Conduct).

The purpose of this letter is to invite you, as a potentially interested party, to comment on the application. Please see the ACCC's publication <u>Authorisation process - the basics</u> for a summary of the authorisation process and how to make a submission to the ACCC.

Interim authorisation

The Applicants have also requested interim authorisation for the Proposed Conduct.

The ACCC endeavours to deal with requests for interim authorisation quickly. In making an assessment as to whether it is appropriate to grant interim authorisation, the ACCC is not required to undertake a full assessment of the benefit and detriment likely to arise as a result of the proposed conduct.

The ACCC decides whether to grant interim authorisation on a case by case basis. Should an applicant request interim authorisation, the ACCC will usually consider a range of factors, including:

- harm to the applicant and other parties if interim authorisation is or is not granted
- possible benefit and detriment to the public
- · the urgency of the matter and
- whether the market would be able to return to substantially its preinterim state if the ACCC should later deny authorisation.

Request for submissions

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements.

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to the applications for authorisation and/or the Applicants' request for interim authorisation and please do so by **28 November 2014.** Submissions should be emailed to adjudication@accc.gov.au with the subject "A91468 & A91469 – Etihad Airways PJSC & Alitalia – submission".

Alternatively, if you would like to provide comments orally, please contact Tanya Hobbs on 02 6243 1029 or via email adjudication@accc.gov.au to organise a suitable time.

Submissions, including oral submissions, will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion. Please see the ACCC's publication <u>Guidelines for excluding information from the public register</u>.

The ACCC will progress its assessment of the application in a timely manner. An indicative timetable is set out below for your information.

Dec 2014 – Jan 2015	Draft determination.
Dec 2014 – Jan 2015	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
Feb – Mar 2015	Final determination.
