Australian Newsagents Federation Application for revocation of authorisation A91134 and A91174 and substitution of new authorisation A91407 - interested party consultation

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) is currently conducting a consultation process on an application for re-authorisation (application for revocation and substitution) received from the Australian Newsagents Federation (ANF) on 3 February 2014.

The ANF is seeking authorisation in its own right and on behalf of its Member State Branches, the Newsagents Association of NSW and the ACT, and the Victorian Newsagents Association to engage in collective bargaining with a range of suppliers. The ANF has proposed that participation in the collective bargaining process will be voluntary for all parties.

The ANF has identified your business as one with whom they would like to collectively bargain with on behalf of their members. The purpose of this letter is to invite you to comment on the ANF's application.

Request for submission

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements.

Further, the ACCC invites you to outline your general experience of the collective bargaining arrangements during the term of the previous authorisation. The ACCC would also welcome your views on the public benefits and detriments you consider have actually resulted from the collective bargaining during the previous authorisation period.

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to the ANF's application for authorisation, please do so by **4 March 2014**. Submissions should be emailed to adjudication@accc.gov.au with the subject "A91407 – Australian Newsagents Federation – submission".

Submissions, including oral submissions, will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion (guidelines are attached).

Timetable

The ACCC will progress its assessment of the application in a timely manner. An indicative timetable is set out below for your information.

3 February 2014	Lodgement of application and supporting submission.
6 February 2014	Public consultation process begins.
4 March 2014	Closing date for submissions from interested parties.
March 2014	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process.
April 2014	Draft determination.
April/May 2014	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
June 2014	Final determination.

Please advise if you do not wish to make a submission at this time, but would like to be informed of the progress of the application at the draft and final determination stages. If you are able to please provide a nominated contact email address for future correspondence.

You can also forward this letter to any other party who may wish to make a submission to the ACCC regarding the application.
