**TAB Limited and Tabcorp Wagering Manager (Vic) Pty Ltd applications for
authorisation A91419 - A91424 - interested party consultation**

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the ACCC) has received applications for authorisation from TAB Limited (**TAB**) and Tabcorp Wagering Manager (Vic) Pty Ltd (**Tabcorp**). The ACCC invites you to comment on the applications.

TAB and Tabcorp are seeking authorisation to give effect to, or make and give effect to arrangements with various overseas wagering operators which allow for:

- the transmission of bets by overseas punters into TAB and Tabcorp operated pools (host arrangements) and/or
- the transmission of bets by Australian punters into overseas pools (guest arrangements);:

TAB and Tabcorp are seeking authorisation for seven years.

Interim authorisation

Tab and Tabcorp have also requested interim authorisation to engage in the conduct.

The ACCC endeavours to deal with requests for interim authorisation quickly. In making an assessment as to whether it is appropriate to grant interim authorisation, the ACCC is not required to undertake a full assessment of the benefit and detriment likely to arise as a result of the proposed conduct.

The ACCC decides whether to grant interim authorisation on a case by case basis. Should an applicant request interim authorisation, the ACCC will usually consider a range of factors, including harm to the applicant and other parties if interim is or is not granted, possible benefit and detriment to the public, the urgency of the matter and whether the market would be able to return to substantially its pre-interim state if the ACCC should later deny authorisation.

Request for submissions

The purpose of this letter is to invite you, as a potentially interested party, to comment on the applications, in particular, the ACCC seeks your views on the likely public benefits and effect on competition, or any other public detriment, from the proposed arrangements. Please see the ACCC's publication [Authorisation process - the basics](#) for a summary of the authorisation process and how to make a submission to the ACCC.

If you intend to provide a submission in relation to TAB's and Tabcorp's applications for authorisation and/or interim authorisation, please do so by **Monday, 2 June 2014**. Submissions should be emailed to adjudication@acc.gov.au with the subject "A91419 – A91424 TAB Limited and Tabcorp Wagering Manager (Vic) Pty Ltd – submission".

Timetable

The ACCC will progress its assessment of the application in a timely manner. An indicative timetable is set out below for your information.

7 May 2014	Lodgement of application and supporting submission.
12 May 2014	Public consultation process begins.
2 June 2014	Closing date for submissions on the applications (including the request for interim authorisation).
16 June 2014	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process.
July 2014	Draft determination and decision regarding interim authorisation.
July 2014	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
August/September 2014	Final determination.
