To ACCC Public Registers/Adjudications Consultations,

I am writing to record my objection to the ACCC's draft deliberation to approve a request by the Infant Nutrition Council (INC) to reauthorise the Marketing in Australia of Infant Formula (MAIF) Agreement for a further 10 years. In making this submission, I request that the ACCC authorise the current MAIF Agreement for only a further one or two years, with a view to conducting a comprehensive review of the Agreement, taking into account new forms of marketing (such as social media), a possible update to the World Health Organisation (WHO) International Code of Marketing of Breast-milk Substitutes, and the current review of the National Breastfeeding Strategy. I believe that we must take a more mindful approach to the promotion of breastfeeding in Australia. In addition to taking account of current research regardig breastfeeding and breast-milk substitutes, we should align more strongly with the WHO Code to support families, and not leave the regulation of the marketing of breast-milk substitutes to the makers of such products. A voluntary code of conduct as a form of self-regulation is hardly sufficient.

Please let us take the time to fully review the existing provisions for marketing breast-milk substitutes to Australian mothers and their families. I urge the Commission to support education and research and to not so easily allow marketing of product to inflitrate this important area of public health.
