Telstra Corporation Limited and TPG Telecom Limited proposed Multi-Operator Core Network commercial arrangements and spectrum sharing – ACCC Determination

The ACCC has issued a determination in respect of the above mentioned application for merger authorisation received on 23 May 2022.

As you are aware, Telstra Corporation Limited (**Telstra**) and TPG Telecom Limited (**TPG**) (the **Applicants**) entered into three interrelated agreements to implement a Multi-Operator Core Network commercial arrangement (**MOCN NaaS**): the MOCN Service Agreement; the Spectrum Authorisation Agreement; and the Mobile Site Transition Agreement (together the **Proposed Transaction**). The Spectrum Authorisation Agreement would authorise Telstra to use TPG's spectrum, which is deemed by the *Radiocommunications Act 1992* (Cth) to be an acquisition under section 50 of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* (Cth) (the **Act**).

The ACCC has decided not to grant authorisation to Telstra and TPG for the Proposed Transaction. The ACCC's determination and a summary of the ACCC's reasons is enclosed, and is also available on the <u>Merger authorisations public register</u>.

The full reasons for the ACCC's determination will be released separately as soon as possible, subject to a confidentiality review by the relevant parties involved. The full reasons will also be available on the <u>Merger authorisations public register</u>.

Application for review

Pursuant to section 101 of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* (Cth), a person dissatisfied with this determination may apply to the Australian Competition Tribunal (the **Tribunal**) for a review of the determination. An application for review must be made within 21 days of the date of this determination; that is, on or before 11 January 2023.

An application for a review of the ACCC's determination should be lodged directly with the Tribunal. The Tribunal is a separate body from the ACCC and is located within the Federal Court of Australia.
