### 1.3 a description of business activities

Bluesfest provides musical Artists to live music events across Australia, providing both domestic and international artists, primarily at the annual East Coast Bluesfest Event held over the Easter long weekend each year and by touring various artists across Australia.

This notification is with respect to international Artists only.

- 3. Provide details of the notified conduct including:
- 3.1 a description of the notified conduct

Bluesfest proposes to contract with international Artists to provide live music at venues at

- a) Tyagarah NSW, and/or
- b) across Australia;

AND provide that the Artist, depending upon the nature of the tour of the act, will either,

- c) For the touring Artists, not perform at another live music event in Australia for a period of up to 6 months before, and up to 3 months after the performances they are contracted to provide, or
- d) For the international Artists that perform at Tyagarah only, not perform at another live music event within up to 500kls of the Tyagarah music venue for a period of up to 6 months before, and up to 3 months after the performances they are contracted to provide.

An "international Artist" in this Notification refers to a musical artist whose place of residence and primary place of business is outside the Commonwealth of Australia.

A "live music event" in this Notification refers to a music event where the artist performs live to an audience present at the venue, and may include streaming in addition to the live audience.

# 3.2 any relevant documents detailing the terms of the notified conduct

There is no particular relevant document. Each international Artist usually has their international agent proffer a contract and the terms of the restriction on performances is negotiated within that contract.

#### 3.3 the rationale for the notified conduct

Bluesfest submits that the notified conduct is necessary:

- a) To give reasonable protection to the investment in the appearance fees paid, and the travel, accommodation, internal transport, security, venue hire, marketing, production and other expenses incurred to bring the Artist to Australia and New Zealand.
- b) If the notified conduct was not imposed then the appearance fees required to bring Artist to Australia would be economically unviable. This may well result in the international Artists not being engaged.
- c) To reasonably protect the ticket sales by Bluesfest for the event and the Artists appearance.
- d) If Bluesfest did not engage the Artists then the customers of live international music in Australia would not have the opportunity to experience their music in a live setting.
- e) To ensure that by having the notified conduct applied Bluesfest can set their ticket prices at lower levels and thus offer the customer better value, and more competition within the Australian live music industry.

# 3.4 any time period relevant to the notified conduct.

The nominated time period relevant to the notified conduct does not have an expiry date as the same exclusive conduct will be applied to each live music event at Tyagarah and for any tours.

There are no documents that were submitted to the Bluesfest board of directors or prepared by or for the notifying parties senior management in relation to the notified conduct, nor any minutes or record of decision made.

5. Provide the names and/or a description of the persons or classes of persons who may be directly impacted by the notified conduct (including targets in collective bargaining or boycott conduct) and detail how or why they might be impacted.

The following classes of persons may be directly impacted by the notified conduct:

a) Existing and potential customers of Bluesfest who attend live music events.

Customers are likely to be impacted as they will need to purchase tickets to the relevant live music events in order to see the relevant Artists perform live. Bluesfest submits that if they did not bring into Australia the relevant Artist, then another competitor might and would likely require the same exclusive dealing in order to make the music tour viable commercially. In which case the customer would experience the same impact.

Further customers would benefit from the notified conduct being applied, as Bluesfest can charge lower ticket prices to its customers.

b) International Artists who enter into contracts with Bluesfest.

Artists may be impacted by not being able to perform live music at competing events during the relevant times, within the geographical region. Bluesfest submits that if an international Artist wished to perform live music in Australia, they would seek to maximise ticket sales and limit their performances such as to attract the largest number of ticket sales to the nominated promoted events, and so limit the number of performances they would undertake.

Further if they entered into contracts with competing live music promoters they would very likely have the same or similar exclusive dealing restrictions as the notifying party seeks.

c) Live music competitors.

Are likely to be impacted as they would not be able to contract with the same international Artists for performances during the exclusive dealing period. Bluesfest submits that the live music promoter industry in Australia is highly competitive and no substantial impact would be imposed by the notified conduct. Further the number of live music Artists in the world is very high and the competitors would be able to contract with other Artists.

# Market information and concentration

6. Describe the products and/or services, and the geographic areas, supplied by the notifying parties. Identify all products and services in which two or more parties to the notified conduct overlap (compete with each other) or have a vertical relationship (e.g. supplier-customer).

#### Services

Bluesfest provides live music performances to the East Coast Bluesfest held over the Easter long weekend at Tyagarah and with tours across Australia. Those tours include:

- a) A venue purchases from Bluesfest the right to present the Artist at their venue, where the venue does the advertising and ticket sales. Those venues usually seek to have some restraint on the Artist to prevent a performance within a time period and geographical region around the subject venue (usually the city in which the venue is located), in order to protect ticket sales.
- b) Bluesfest hires a venue and does the promotion and ticket sales of the music performance.
- c) Bluesfest sells to another music promoter the right to stage the Artist at a venue in Australia, where the other music promoter then does the promotion and ticket sales.

#### Geographic Areas

Australia wide

New Zealand through related entities.

#### Overlapping relationships

Bluesfest Tours Pty Ltd provides international Artists to perform at Tyagarah and has a vertical relationship with Byron Bay Bluesfest Pty Ltd which conducts the Easter Bluesfest event, and purchases the international Artist performance from Bluesfest.

7. Describe the relevant industry or industries. Where relevant, describe the sales process, the supply chains of any products or services involved, and the manufacturing process.

The live music industry is an international market place, with musicians moving freely across international borders, and able (with few barriers) to perform anywhere in the world.

For Australian music promoters to attract international Artists to Australia they are usually required to offer higher appearance fees than may be payable for performances in Europe or Noth America; due primarily to the geographic distance of Australia and the population size.

# Size of the live music market

It is estimated that the live music industry in Australia generates over \$1 billion in ticket revenue annually.

Live Performance Australia (LPA) in their Live Performance Industry in Australia Report conducted with Ernst & Young, made the following findings:

Note: LPA has not yet published a Ticket Attendance and Revenue Report for 2022.

The figures above evidence the impact of Covid in both 2020 and 2021 to the live music market. Figures for 2022 may show recovery however they have yet to be published. The figures for 2018 and 2019, in Bluesfest's submission, show the size of the live music market in Australia.

There are live music venues right across Australia from very large venues such as the MCG in Melbourne and Accor Stadium in Sydney to large halls such as the Opera House, large hotels and clubs in cities, to small hotels and clubs in rural towns. There is no data on the actual number of live music venues across Australia. Bluesfest submits it would be in the thousands.

Time wise, a consumer can attend and listen to live music at any time of the year; and in many locations up to seven days per week.

The BOP Consulting World Cities Culture Report for 2018 contained surveys of Melbourne and Sydney and made the following findings:

The BOP figures above cannot be accurately extrapolated into other cities and towns in Australia, however Bluesfest submits they give a guide to the number of live music venues and performances in the live music market.

#### Music Festivals in Australia

The number of live music festivals across Australia is also very large. Attached in Schedule "A" is a non-exhaustive list of the known live music festivals in Australia in 2022-2023.

International music Artists may play at any number of these festivals.

#### Supply process

The supply of international Artists to live music events by promoters, involves the promoter or the Artists approaching each other with a view to arranging a live performance at a single venue or a tour. The parties enter into a contract and the promoter then arranges the visas, travel and accommodation and relevant music venues within Australia.

The Artist usually travels with an entourage (but not always) and brings some of their preferred musical equipment, all by international airlines.

8. In respect of the overlapping products and/or services identified, provide estimated market shares for each of the parties where readily available.

Bluesfest cannot estimate the market share held by the other large live music promoters such as.

- a) Live Nation
- b) Frontier Touring
- c) TEG Dainty
- d) Bohm Presents
- e) Chugg Entertainment
- f) Secret Sounds

Each of these business operators are in close competition across the whole of the Australian live music performance market. They are each vying for good talent and attraction of the public to attend and pay the ticket price of listening to the live performance.

Each of these competitors are:

- a) able to deliver a live music performance into any suitable venue in any city, town or suitable rural location across Australia,
- can import any international live music performance and present them anywhere in Australia, and

 c) can contract any domestic live music performer and present them anywhere in Australia.

9. In assessing a notification, the ACCC takes into account competition faced by the parties to the proposed conduct. #### 9.1 existing competitors

The larger existing competitors are listed in item 8 above. The flexibility and low barriers to bringing international Artists to a live music venue from the MCG to a hotel in a local town, act as a natural barrier to price rises, and enable a wide choice to always be available to the public. The extremely wide range of available venues, and flexibility of contractual terms as between Artist and promoter enable the competition to remain vigorous.

#### 9.2 likely entry by new competitors

Bluesfest submits that the barriers to entry of new competitors providing live music promotion is low, as those competitors can include:

- a) new domestic music promoters entering the industry, with little physical infrastructure needed
- b) overseas music promoters moving into the Australian market with few barriers,
- c) local new venues being constructed with live music facilities,
- existing venues (hotels, clubs, wine estates, rural properties etc) making renovations to provide live music facilities and or festivals,

#### 9.3 any countervailing power of customers and/or suppliers

#### Customers

Customers can access live music across Australia almost 7 days per week (especially in the cities and some larger towns).

#### Suppliers - Promoters

Other music promoters can increase competition by bringing other international Artists into Australia during the time periods the subject of this notification, and thus positively impact the level of competition for ticket sales within the Australian live music market.

#### Live Streaming

Live streaming of music events has made the market truly international, and a customer can access live music across from the world from their own smartphone/laptop/computer at any time or by visiting certain venues that stream the music event.

#### 9.4 any other relevant factors.

There are no other relevant factors.

### **Public benefit**

10. Describe the benefits to the public that are likely to result from the notified conduct.

There are significant benefits to the notified conduct.

#### Benefit for international Artists

The Artists would not without the support of the music promoter usually be able to tour Australia and provide live performances; as the logistics side of a tour is usually beyond the scope of the Artists skills and resources. Such issues as ticket sales, visas, accommodation, internal transport, security, venue hire, marketing, production etc; are usually handled by the promoter.

The Artist gets to promote their music into the Australian market and sell their merchandise.

# Benefits for customers

The customers have the opportunity to experience international Artists perform live in Australia.

The ticket prices are able to be kept lower as the Artist has agreed to the notified conduct and so Bluesfest does not have to factor in the risk of the Artist diluting the ticket revenue by performing in the restraint period in the relevant geographical area. Further the notified conduct provides some protection to the ticket sales, by not having the same Artist perform outside the contracted venues.

### Other benefits

The accommodation industry has an increase in use and revenue by the Artists, their entourage, and the customers booking accommodation in and around the live music event.

The travel industry obtains a substantial benefit from the international Artist travel and the customers from across Australia who travel to see the Artist.

The hospitality industry obtains a significant benefit from the customers purchasing food and beverages associated with the live music event and the travel to and from the event.

Merchandising and clothing industries benefit from the sale of items related to the event and to the international Artists merchandise.

There are cultural and social benefits to live music being provided and especially international Artists as the customer are able to experience the different cultural expression of music. The other benefits include social capital, a greater sense of wellbeing and community.

It has been estimated that for every \$1.00 spent on live music in Australia, \$3.00 of benefit is delivered to the wider Australian community.

This 3:1 ratio feeds many sectors of the Australian economy with revenue and thus fosters better competition across a number of industries.
