1.3 a description of business activities

Bluesfest provides musical Artists to the annual Easter Bluesfest Event held over the five day Easter long weekend each year at Tyagarah.

This notification is with respect to Domestic Artists only at the Easter Bluesfest Event.

"Domestic Artists" means a musical artist whose place of residence and business is within the Commonwealth of Australia.

"Easter Bluesfest Event" means the annual Easter Bluesfest festival event held over the Easter long weekend for five days at the festival grounds, 30 Tanner Lane, Tyagarah, near Byron Bay NSW.

The Bluesfest Group of companies has a high reputation in the delivery of quality live music performances. Some of the awards gained by the Group over the last 20 years include:

- 3. Provide details of the notified conduct including:
- 3.1 a description of the notified conduct

Bluesfest proposes to contract with Domestic Artists to provide live music at the Easter Bluesfest Event at Tyagarah.

AND provide that the Artist will not perform at another live music event within a distance up to 250 kilometres of the Easter Bluesfest Event at Tyagarah (**Geographical Region**) for a period of up to four (4) months before, and up to one (1) month after the performance/s ("Exclusive Dealing Period") they are contracted to provide at the Easter Bluesfest Event.

"Geographical Region" means any place within a distance of 250 kilometres radius from the Easter Bluesfest Event at 30 Tanner Lane, Tyagarah NSW.

A "live music event" in this Notification refers to a music event where the artist performs live to an audience present at the venue, and may include streaming in addition to the live audience.

3.2 any relevant documents detailing the terms of the notified conduct

It is intended that the documents would provide that:

"The Artist agrees not to perform at another Live Music Event within 250 kilometres of the Bluesfest site for a period of four (4) months before, and one (1) month after the performance/s"

"A "Live Music Event" refers to a music event where the artist performs live to an audience present at the venue, and may include streaming in addition to the live audience"

It is intended that on a case by case basis negotiate with Domestic Artists should they wish to perform at another live music event within the Exclusive Dealing Period and Geographical Region. This is usually negotiated at the time of entering into the contract.

3.3 the rationale for the notified conduct

Bluesfest submits that the notified conduct is necessary:

- a) To give reasonable protection to the investment in the appearance fees paid, and the accommodation, transport, security, marketing, production and other expenses incurred to bring the Artist to Tyagarah and produce the Easter Bluesfest Event.
- b) If the notified conduct was not imposed then the appearance fees required to bring the Artist to Tyagarah would be economically unviable. This may result in some circumstances where the Domestic Artists not being engaged.
- c) To reasonably protect the ticket sales by Bluesfest for the Easter Bluesfest Event and the Artists appearance.
- d) If Bluesfest did not engage the Domestic Artists then the customers of the Easter Bluesfest Event would not have the opportunity to experience the range of music provided by Bluesfest in a live setting.
- e) To ensure that by having the notified conduct applied Bluesfest can set their ticket prices at lower levels and thus offer the customer better value, and more competition within the Australian live music industry.

3.4 any time period relevant to the notified conduct.

The nominated time period relevant to the notified conduct does not have an expiry date as the same exclusive conduct will be applied to each Easter Bluesfest Event at Tyagarah.

4. Provide documents submitted to the notifying party's board or prepared by or for the notifying party's senior management for purposes of assessing or making a decision in relation to the notified conduct and any minutes or record of the decision made.

There are no documents that were submitted to the Bluesfest board of directors or prepared by or for the notifying parties senior management in relation to the notified conduct, nor any minutes or record of decision made.

5. Provide the names and/or a description of the persons or classes of persons who may be directly impacted by the notified conduct (including targets in collective bargaining or boycott conduct) and detail how or why they might be impacted.

The following classes of persons may be directly impacted by the notified conduct:

a) Existing and potential customers of Bluesfest who attend live music events.

Customers are likely to be impacted as they will need to purchase tickets to the Easter Bluesfest Event in order to see the relevant Domestic Artists perform live. Bluesfest submits that if they did not engage the relevant Artist, then another competitor might and would likely require the same exclusive dealing in order to make their live music event viable commercially. In which case the customer would experience the same impact.

Further customers would benefit from the notified conduct being applied, as Bluesfest can charge lower ticket prices to its customers.

b) Domestic Artists who enter into contracts with Bluesfest.

Artists may be impacted by not being able to perform live music at competing events during the Exclusive Dealing Period, within the Geographical Region.

Bluesfest submits that if a Domestic Artist wished to perform live music in Australia, the Artist would seek to maximise ticket sales and limit their performances such as to attract the largest number of ticket sales for the live music event and would during a reasonable time frame and within a reasonable geographical area not perform a competing live music event, and so limit the number of performances they would undertake, and maximise ticket sales.

Further if they entered into contracts with competing live music promoters they would very likely have the same or similar exclusive dealing restrictions as the notifying party seeks.

Bluesfest does on a case by case basis negotiate with Domestic Artists should they wish to perform at another live music event within the Exclusive Dealing Period and Geographical Region. This has happened a number of times.

c) Live music competitors.

Are likely to be impacted as they would not be able to contract with the same Domestic Artists for performances during the Exclusive Dealing Period, within the Geographical Region. Bluesfest submits that the live music industry in Australia is highly competitive and no substantial impact would be imposed by the notified conduct.

Further the number of live music Artists in Australia is large and the competitors would be able to contract with other Artists.

Market information and concentration

6. Describe the products and/or services, and the geographic areas, supplied by the notifying parties. Identify all products and services in which two or more parties to the notified conduct overlap (compete with each other) or have a vertical relationship (e.g. supplier-customer).

Services

Bluesfest provides live music performances at the Easter Bluesfest Event held over the Easter long weekend at Tyagarah. Bluesfest seeks:

- a) To provide broad genres of music at the Easter Bluesfest Event, so that the ticket holders can at one venue experience a variety of music at the festival.
- b) To provide the ticket holders with camping opportunities, merchandise vendors and food vendors for an immersive experience while listening to a wide variety of musical artists from Australia and all over the world.

Geographic Areas

The Geographical Region the subject of this exclusive dealing; is within a 250 kilometre radius of the Easter Bluesfest Event held at Tyagarah NSW.

Overlapping relationships

Bluesfest Tours Pty Ltd also provides international Artists to perform at the Easter Bluesfest Event and has a vertical relationship with Byron Bay Bluesfest Pty Ltd which conducts the Easter Bluesfest Event.

7. Describe the relevant industry or industries. Where relevant, describe the sales process, the supply chains of any products or services involved, and the manufacturing process.

The live music industry is both an international and domestic market place, with musicians moving freely across international and domestic borders, and able (with few barriers) to perform anywhere in the world.

Size of the live music market

It is estimated that the live music industry in Australia generates over \$1 billion in ticket revenue annually.

Live Performance Australia (LPA) in their Live Performance Industry in Australia Report conducted with Ernst & Young, made the following findings:

The figures above evidence the impact of Covid in both 2020 and 2021 to the live music market. Figures for 2022 may show recovery however they have yet to be published. The figures for 2018 and 2019, in Bluesfest's submission, show the size of the live music market in Australia.

There are live music venues right across Australia from very large venues such as the MCG in Melbourne and Accor Stadium in Sydney to large halls such as the Opera House, large hotels and clubs in cities, to small hotels and clubs in rural towns. There is no data on the actual number of live music venues across Australia. Bluesfest submits it would be in the thousands.

Time wise, a consumer can attend and listen to live music at any time of the year; and in many locations up to seven days per week.

The BOP Consulting World Cities Culture Report for 2018 contained surveys of Melbourne and Sydney and made the following findings:

The BOP figures above cannot be accurately extrapolated into other cities and towns in Australia, however Bluesfest submits they give a guide to the number of live music venues and performances in the live music market.

Music Festivals in Australia

The number of live music festivals across Australia is also very large. Attached in Schedule "A" is a non-exhaustive list of the known live music festivals in Australia in 2022-2023.

Domestic Artists may play at any number of these festivals, as long as the festival is outside the Geographical Region within the exclusive dealing time periods.

Supply process

The supply of Domestic Artists to live music events by promoters, involves the promoter; or the Artist, their agent or management entity; approaching each other with a view to arranging a live performance at a single venue or a tour; in this case a single venue at Tyagarah.

The parties enter into a contract that defines the terms of engagement, detailing the responsibilities of each party. For example which party provides accommodation, travel etc. Some deals the promoter pays a Fee only and the Domestic Artist covers travel, accommodation, ground transport and other deals the promoter pays a Fee plus these or a selection of these.

The Artist usually travels with an entourage (but not always) and brings some of their preferred musical equipment, usually by air.

8. In respect of the overlapping products and/or services identified, provide estimated market shares for each of the parties where readily available.

Bluesfest cannot estimate the market share held by the other large live music promoters such as.

- a) Live Nation
- b) Frontier Touring

- c) TEG Dainty
- d) Bohm Presents
- e) Chugg Entertainment
- f) Secret Sounds

Each of these business operators are in close competition across the whole of the Australian live music performance market. They are each vying for good talent and attraction of the public to attend and pay the ticket price of listening to the live performance.

Each of these competitors are:

- a) able to deliver a live music performance into any suitable venue in any city, town or suitable rural location across Australia,
- can contract any domestic live music performer and present them anywhere in Australia.
- 9. In assessing a notification, the ACCC takes into account competition faced by the parties to the proposed conduct. Describe the factors that would limit or prevent any ability for the parties involved to raise prices, reduce quality or choice, reduce innovation, or coordinate rather than compete vigorously. 9.1 existing competitors

The larger existing competitors are listed in item 8 above. The flexibility and low barriers to engaging Domestic Artists across Australia to perform at a live music venue from the MCG to a hotel in a local town, act as a natural impediment to price rises, and enable a wide choice to always be available to the public. The extremely wide range of available venues, and flexibility of contractual terms as between Artist and promoter enable the competition to remain vigorous.

9.2 likely entry by new competitors

Bluesfest submits that the barriers to entry of new competitors providing live music promotion across Australia is low, as those competitors can include:

- new domestic music promoters entering the industry, with little physical infrastructure needed,
- overseas music promoters moving into the Australian market and engaging Domestic Artists to perform within Australia with few barriers,
- c) local new venues being constructed with live music facilities,
- d) existing venues (hotels, clubs, wine estates, rural properties etc) making renovations to provide live music facilities and or festivals.

9.3 any countervailing power of customers and/or suppliers

Customers

Customers can access live music across Australia almost 7 days per week (especially in the cities and some larger towns).

Suppliers - Promoters

Other music promoters can increase competition by bringing other Domestic Artists into the Geographical Region during the Exclusive Dealing Period the subject of this notification, and thus positively impact the level of competition for ticket sales within the Geographical Region during the Exclusive Dealing Period in the live music market.

Live Streaming

Live streaming of music events has made the market truly international, and a customer can access live music across from the world from their own smartphone/laptop/computer at any time or by visiting certain venues that stream the music event.

9.4 any other relevant factors.

There are no other relevant factors.

Public benefit

10. Describe the benefits to the public that are likely to result from the notified conduct.

Provide information, data, documents or other evidence relevant to the ACCC's assessment of the public benefits.

There are significant benefits to the notified conduct.

Benefit for Domestic Artists

The Artists would obtain a contract to perform at one of Australia's prestige live music festivals, which would promote their music into the Australian market and sell their merchandise. They would only be precluded from performing at another venue within the Geographical Region for the exclusive dealing period before and after the Easter Bluesfest Event.

They would be free to perform at any time across the rest of Australia outside the Geographical Region.

Benefits for customers

The customers have the opportunity to experience Domestic Artists perform live at Tyagarah.

The ticket prices are able to be kept lower as the Artist has agreed to the notified conduct and so Bluesfest does not have to factor in the risk of the Artist diluting the ticket revenue by performing in the Exclusive Dealing Period in the Geographical Region. Further the notified conduct provides some protection to the ticket sales, by not having the same Domestic Artist perform in the exclusive dealing period in the Geographical Region.

Other benefits

The accommodation industry has an increase in use and revenue by the Artists, their entourage, and the customers booking accommodation in and around the live music event.

The travel industry obtains a substantial benefit from the Domestic Artist travel and the customers from across Australia who travel to see the Artist.

The hospitality industry obtains a significant benefit from the customers purchasing food and beverages associated with the live music event and the travel to and from the event.

Merchandising and clothing industries benefit from the sale of items related to the event and to the Domestic Artists merchandise.

Stall holders selling food, beverages and retail items benefit from those sales and the undertaking of their business ventures.

There are cultural and social benefits to live music being provided including the Domestic and international Artists performing at the same live music festival in a regional location. The other benefits include social capital, a greater sense of wellbeing and community.

It has been estimated that for every \$1.00 spent on live music in Australia, \$3.00 of benefit is delivered to the wider Australian community.

This 3:1 ratio feeds many sectors of the Australian economy with revenue and thus fosters better competition across a number of industries.
