RECITALS

1. On 13 March 2006, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) accepted Undertakings from GlaxoSmithKline Australia Pty Limited (GSK Australia) in accordance with section 87B of the *Trade Practices Act 1974* (the Act) (the Original Undertakings).
2. The Commission has agreed to the variation of the Original Undertakings as set out in this variation (this Variation).

COMMENCEMENT

3. This Variation comes into effect when:
 - (1) this Variation is executed by GSK Australia; and
 - (2) the ACCC accepts this Variation so executed.


VARIATION TO ORIGINAL UNDERTAKINGS

4. Clause 12(12) of the Original Undertakings is amended by deleting the number (9) and inserting the number (11).
5. Clause 12 (13) of the Original Undertakings is amended by deleting the number (9) and inserting the number (11).
6. Clause 12(14) of the Original Undertakings is amended by:
 - (1) deleting the number (9) and inserting the number (11); and
 - (2) deleting the number (11) and inserting the number (13).
7. Clause 1 of Annexure A to the Original Undertaking is amended by deleting the number (6) and inserting the number (8).
8. Clause 2 of Annexure A to the Original Undertaking is amended by deleting the number (7) and inserting the number (9).


