CONSENT TO WITHDRAWAL OF SECTION 87B UNDERTAKING


BACKGROUND

1. On 25 October 2007, Healthscope Limited ACN 006 405 152 (**Healthscope**) gave, and the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (**Commission**) accepted, an undertaking under section 87B of the *Trade Practices Act 1974* (Cth) (**the Act**) (**the Undertaking**) in relation to Healthscope's proposed acquisition of Symbion Health Limited (**Symbion**) (**the proposed acquisition**).
2. On 27 November 2007, Healthscope announced it had decided not to proceed with the proposed acquisition. Symbion was subsequently acquired by Primary Health Care Limited on 28 April 2008.
3. As the proposed acquisition did not occur, the obligations contained in the Undertaking are now redundant.
4. Healthscope has requested the Commission's consent to the withdrawal of the Undertaking, and the Commission gives that consent.

WITHDRAWAL


5. Pursuant to section 87B(2) of the Act, the Undertaking is withdrawn in its entirety, with effect on and from the date on which the Commission gives its consent to the withdrawal.


